### PRESIDENT'S REPORT

It gives me great pleasure to present the President's Report for Water Polo Victoria for financial year 2024-2025. The past 12 months have been a period of change for Water Polo Victoria, with a new CEO and management team recruited and a shake-up of the competition calendar in an attempt to provide more opportunities for more athletes. While not without its challenges, the last twelve months has seen a continued growth in participation, and had Victorian athletes represent on both the national and international stage (including at the Paris Olympics). I am proud to reflect on the collective efforts of our athletes, coaches, officials, volunteers, clubs, and supporters who have contributed to another successful year.

The 2024-25 season saw 22 Victorian clubs (including the Phoenix) registered with WPV, and an increase in membership of almost 10%. We had similar numbers participate in our flagship 'Metro Summer' Competitions (as the previous year) and our Winter Junior competition, plus the addition of Senior Summer Splash, gave plenty of Polo opportunities for clubs.

Our State League competitions continued to deliver high-quality water polo, with several thrilling finals on Saturday 7th of December showcasing the depth of talent in Victoria. Congratulations to all teams who participated and especially to our premiers in each division.

As noted elsewhere in this report, our commitment to athlete development has remained strong over the past 12 months, with regular opportunities being delivered for junior athletes in particular in both Melbourne and Wodonga / Albury.

Victorian teams performed admirably at national championships, and although there were no podium finishes our athletes represented Victoria with pride, demonstrating sportsmanship and determination. A number of individuals were selected for Australian teams to attend World Championships, as well as touring squads, a testament to the strength of our pathways and the dedication of our coaches.

A key focus this year was expanding the accessibility and inclusivity of water polo. The Water Polo Victoria team have rolled out a range of innovative programs and opportunities for existing and new players alike, including the short-form Summer Splash, Come-n-Try, Social Sundays, Thursday Social Competition and Flippa Ball. We also continued to support individual clubs to run their own initiatives, and thank those who are involved in promoting our sport and attracting first-timers to don a cap and get in the pool.

While this saw some good 'quick wins', we also recognise that the proportion of female water polo athletes regularly competing in Victoria continues to lag behind men, and is out of sync with what is occurring in other states. Water Polo Victoria remains keen to address this and will continue to try and think 'outside the box' to find ways to attract and keep female athletes in the sport.

I am pleased to report that Water Polo Victoria remains in a sound financial position, and is relatively strong compared with its interstate counterparts. Prudent management has enabled us to invest in development initiatives and only pass through modest increases in fees for members. A focus of the next 12-18 months is to secure some additional sponsors, to further support our strategic goals.

I would like to extend my sincere thanks to our Board, our new CEO Regan Longfield and his team, and our volunteers, whose tireless work underpins everything we achieve. Thank you also to our sponsors, KAP7 and Bio Revive for all their support. Most importantly, I acknowledge our players, coaches, officials, and families – your passion and commitment are the heart of water polo in Victoria.

Also, a special acknowledgement to outgoing President Tom Janolshami who stepped down in December 2024, and also to Simon Devine who finished as Water Polo Victoria CEO at about the same time.

As we look toward the 2025-26 season, Water Polo Victoria is committed to further growth, innovation, and excellence. We will be launching our new Strategic Plan in early 2026 which will signpost our intention to continue to prioritise participation, development, and community connection, ensuring our sport remains vibrant and welcoming for all.

Thank you for your continued support. I look forward to another exciting year ahead.

### **CHIEF EXECUTIVE OFFICER REPORT**

The 2024/2025 year saw Water Polo Victoria once again focusing on consolidation of the business, whilst also taking significant strides forward in multiple areas.

- Water Polo Victoria have commenced a review of our strategic plan, with a re-vamped and re-focused plan to guide us into a prosperous future for the sport.
- Continued investment into capacity building and education of our leaders, focusing on areas including Volunteering, Customer Experience, Inclusion and Board Skills.
- Delivery of the first year of our new competition calendar, which included the introduction of the brand-new Senior Summer Splash Competition, Senior Social Competition, Junior FlippaBall and Term 2 Club Program support.
- Review and adoption of updated policies including Water Polo Victoria Competition By-Laws, Junior State Team Selection Policy, Country Selection Policy, Athlete Agreement/Coach Agreement and Social Media Policy. Water Polo Victoria is in constant review of by-laws and current/non-existent policies, ensuring we as a sport strive for best practice.

Water Polo Victoria also saw a change in Chief Executive Officer in November of 2024, with Regan Longfield taking over from outgoing CEO, Simon Devine. This change marked a transitionary period for the Water Polo Victoria team through to July 2025, with the team comprising of just one full-time staff member in the CEO, alongside Perri Randall as our part-time casual Competitions Manager. We utilised this period to go to market for a new Administration & Development Officer, whilst also gaining Water Polo Australia support for a Performance Pathways Manager. With these roles now filled, we look forward to launching into the 25-26 year in a big way.

Water Polo Victoria Competitions continue to grow and Perri does an incredible job of organising all aspects of our calendar, and ensuring our clubs are well looked after. Our premier summer competitions for both Junior and Senior saw an increase in the number of teams entering as compared to the previous year and our dedicated Grand Final days have been a huge success, particularly with the addition of live streaming for the seniors. We rolled out the Senior Summer Splash competition for Feb-Mar of 25, which saw almost 40 teams enter for the inaugural version of this format. We also returned to Ballarat for the Vic Country Championships for the first time since 2022, with 15 teams entering for what was a great weekend.

Our Performance Pathways Program is an ever-evolving space, and Water Polo Victoria has invested more resources and funding into supporting the growth of our top talent here in the state of Victoria. We were thrilled to once again take 4 teams away to the 13&U Development Carnival in Hobart, with our youngest state athletes representing the navy blue well, both in and out of the water. The U15s & U17s programs had a strong end to the 2024 calendar year. Our 17&U Boys squad won the 2024 Interstate Challenge in Canberra, whilst our 15&U Boys finished second in the 2024 East Coast Challenge which we host in Melbourne each year. There was a mix of results at the 2024 National State Championships on the Gold Coast, with a highlight being our 17&U Girls performing well to finish 4<sup>th</sup>. Several individual athletes also achieved success within these respective tournaments either through awards or National Squad Selection.

Greig Richardson (Spindles) continued to help guide the Water Polo Victoria Academy program in 24-25. Engagement with our Metro Academy & Development + our Regional Academy in Albury/Wodonga has continued to grow, and we have consolidated our programs in this space. We want to invest further into all our athletes, and coaches, that enter the performance pathway, and we are excited for the future of this space and how it feeds into the growing success of our state teams.

A big thank you to all our State and Academy coaches who generously give their time and energy to deliver such a valuable experience for our athletes. The progress and enjoyment our athletes gain are a direct result of the dedication you show on the pool deck. Water Polo Victoria is committed to continuing its investment in coaching and supporting clubs to engage their coaches in ongoing development. I encourage anyone who has an interest in coaching, at any level, to get involved and be part of our growing coaching community.

In the Participation & Development space, Water Polo Victoria pursued several initiatives to grow the profile of our sport and create more tangible links for more participants to play our sport. In a change from the usual Autumn competition, Water Polo Victoria opened Term 2 (April-June) as an opportunity for clubs to engage in new programs aimed at building community and growing participation. Water Polo Victoria allocated funding support to several clubs to run a variety of programs such as Come & Try's, FlippaBall and Inter-Club Competitions, all of which proved successful and have had a lasting impact. Water Polo Victoria also ran an 8-week Thursday evening social competition, which had over 60 participants playing polo, the majority of whom were new to the sport. The team continued to engage with schools, universities, leisure facilities and councils to put on Water Polo activities and events across the state.

I would like to extend my sincere thanks to our referees, pool controllers, and mentors. They take on some of the most challenging and often underappreciated roles within our organisation. Much like our approach to coaching, we are committed to investing in their development and education. With continued support from our clubs, we are confident that we can grow this group in line with our expanding membership. A special thanks to David Smyth for helping with the coordination of our referees during the latest financial year.

Thanks also to our partners and all the leisure facilities who help us put on our competitions, events and initiatives. In particular MSAC, Caulfield Grammar, Aligned Leisure, Camberwell Grammar, Hawthorn Aquatic and Leisure Centre and Melbourne Girls Grammar.

I could not do my role without the unwavering support of the Board of Water Polo Victoria. The directors who sit on the Water Polo Victoria Board are passionate, intelligent and hard-working, and we are excited to continue to build and strengthen this great sport. As always, we are on the lookout for good people to join our board to ensure our sport moves in the right direction. Another huge thanks to all the work the Water Polo Victoria team has been doing over the 24/25 financial year. We are a small team, however a special thanks to Simon Devine and Perri Randall who have worked tirelessly to ensure Water Polo Victoria provide the best we can to you, our community.

I would like to conclude by expressing my sincere thanks to the Water Polo Victoria community, our clubs, committees, volunteers, participants, and parents/guardians. Your dedication and support are the driving forces behind our success. Without you, the many achievements we celebrate would not be possible. We look forward to continuing to grow this community, creating even more opportunities for people to play our sport and share in our future successes.

I am grateful for how the Water Polo Victoria Board and community have embraced me as I have stepped up into this role, and the support that has been given has been incredible. We have big plans for our great sport here in Victoria, and I can't wait to get stuck in with a new and revitalised team for 25-26.

### **DEVELOPMENT & ACADEMY REPORT**

2024-2025 has proved another busy year in the Participation and Development space for Water Polo Victoria. We strongly believe that investment in new and innovative spaces will help to increase the exposure of our great sport. We want to have more people, playing more often, and we have sought out ways to help put the water polo ball in the hands of a greater number of participants.

A special thanks to my colleagues Simon Devine, Perri Randall and Greig Richardson for all your support, and for the Water Polo Victoria board for championing the work we do.

- Water Polo Victoria ran FlippaBall sessions in the shallow end at Hawthorn Aquatic & Leisure Centre during our 24/25 Junior Summer Season. Over 50 unique participants signed up for these events and showed the appetite there is for beginner polo.
- Water Polo Victoria Supported clubs to run their own participation and development initiatives in Term 2 of 2025. This included the Community Water Polo Autumn Invitational, Social Polo at VU and several Come&Try initiatives.
- Worked with dozens of schools across the state to provide coaches, resources and referees for a variety of programs. These included Water Polo round robins at swimming carnivals, Water Polo PE classes and Flippa Schools programs, engaging over a thousand students.
- Water Polo Victoria Social Sunday's programs saw over 150+ participants come and play polo in a relaxed and non-competitive environment. We also saw 20% of attendees go on to join a club during the 24-25 year.
- Water Polo Victoria ran a Thursday evening social competition for seniors, with over 60 participants signing up (many of them brand new)
- Water Polo Victoria organised competition fixtures and referees for AGSV School competition, which had a total
  of 24 teams between Years 7 & 12. Water Polo Victoria also coordinated referees for APS competition and GSV
  finals and rep matches.
- SRV Together More Active Grant funds have been used on several workshops and bodies of work thus far, including Volunteering Victoria, Coach and Referee workshops, regional referee workshops, Child Safety resources and Inclusion workshops.

Through our development initiatives, Water Polo Victoria continues to engage new stakeholders, build meaningful partnerships, and collaborate on projects and programs designed to increase the sport's visibility and reach within the community. We believe that by providing tangible opportunities and clear pathways, the state's peak body can generate strong returns on investment through player growth, enhanced brand reputation, and deeper community engagement.

I would like to thank everyone within the community for their support and vision regarding the importance of development as a key strategic aim of the organisation, particularly in growing the reach and accessibility of the sport to a larger audience. The list above is just some of the work that has been done within this space, and I look forward to working with many more stakeholders to grow this great sport in Victoria.



### **ACADEMY & PERFORMANCE PATHWAYS**

The Water Polo Victoria Performance Pathways Program continues to develop, and Water Polo Victoria has put plans in place to refresh all our programs. The development of our Performance Pathways program is always in pursuit of giving our teams, athletes and coaches the greatest chance to excel on the national and international stage.

Term 1 and Term 2 of the 2025 Academy program was split into two tiers, allowing both skill and age to be better matched to create the best environment for all engaging with the Water Polo Victoria Academy.

We are pleased to have gone through an extensive recruitment process for a new Performance Pathways Manager and have welcomed champion Olympian, Rowie Webster, to the Water Polo Victoria team to build our programs and advocate for our athletes and coaches. Special thanks to Greig Richardson for his continued work in this space as well, and Chloe Lim, who has been a standout coach at Water Polo Victoria Academy all year.

**Participant numbers 24-25 - Academy** (190 total athlete engagements: *Term 3 2024*– 40, *Term 4 2024* – 50 *Term 1* 2025 – 30, *Term 2* 2025 – 25)

**Participant numbers 24-25 - Development** (54 total athlete engagements: *Term 3 2024*– 18, *Term 4 2024* – 10, *Term 1* 2025 – 20, *Term 2* 2025 – 15)

### **Key Highlights:**

- 1. Victoria Phoenix engagement: Water Polo Victoria has once again provided an opportunity for Phoenix players to attend Academy as coaches, which has helped to connect our young talent to experienced senior players. We will continue to work with Phoenix and grow the partnership in this area.
- 2. Competitions: State Teams have experienced the highest number of trial participants in many years, making selection decisions increasingly competitive. This growth can be partly attributed to the revitalised Academy program. As athletes continue to show greater commitment to Academy attendance and training intensity, we anticipate improved results at both regional and national levels. A key focus of the Water Polo Victoria Academy is to strengthen the culture of player expectations around training volume and work ethic, and encouragingly, we've made strong progress in this area over the past year.
- 3. Coach Pathways: The Academy and Development programs continue to play a pivotal role in supporting the growth and progression of coaching talent across the state. These platforms provide structured opportunities for coaches to develop their skills, gain high-level experience, and contribute to athlete development. Notably, several coaches involved in these programs have advanced to State Team coaching roles and have been accepted into the WPA Coaching Pathway program, reflecting the effectiveness of Water Polo Victoria's coach development framework.
- 4. *Regional Academy:* The Regional Academy in Albury/Wodonga continues to have strong engagement and provides another opportunity for talented athletes and coaches on the border to connect with Water Polo Victoria. We look forward to continuing to service O&M in this space.

Water Polo Victoria looks forward to growing these programs and creating a strong elite pathway and culture of excellence and success!

### **COMPETITIONS REPORT**

### **Summer State League Competition 2024-2025 Juniors**

This season saw a return to our previous structure of October – March Junior games. It was fantastic to maintain the previous seasons team numbers with 36 teams competing across 12U, 14U, Youth and Junior grades. We also introduced a Girls combined competition in recognition that a number of clubs were unable to enter girls teams at 14U, Youth or Junior. The competition finished with a Final day of semi-final and grand final games at MSAC

### **Summer State League Competition 2024 Seniors**

Our main competition for our Seniors also reverted to its previous timeline of July – December 2024. With 52 Senior teams, 2 less than the previous season. The use of Caulfield Grammar throughout the season continued to provide a 30m pool opportunity for MSL1. The competition ended with its regular week of finals and grand finals returning to MSAC outdoor.

### **Winter Junior Competition 2025**

Based on club feedback, there were no competitions played during Term 2, 2025. The Juniors commenced a short winter season during Term 3, that saw 19 teams (one more than 2024) play a 'mini series' of games and a laddered final game. It was pleasing to welcome 4 players from Wodonga Dolphins Water Polo Club to the Youth Girls competition.

### **2024 Victorian Country Championships**

We took the Victorian Country Championships to Ballarat and thank Ballarat Water Polo club for hosting us over the two very busy days of water polo. Water Polo Victoria introduced a new Country Athlete selection policy which saw each club nominate a selector. Men's and Women's teams were selected and travelled to the Gold Coast in May. We congratulate both teams on finishing 4<sup>th</sup>, after losing closely contested bronze medal games.

### 2025 East Coast Challenge

We hosted the East Coast Challenge Tournament, as a warm up for 15U National State Championships. We hosted teams from Queensland, NSW, Tasmania, Victoria and for the first time South Australia. This event provides not only an opportunity for our athletes, but our referees also benefit from mentors and feedback during and following each game.



### **Current Referee numbers** (see attached table)

The referees available for these competitions currently number 57, this number is up from the 40 last year. We have had good interest from Juniors who have been helped along by the increased experience of those who have kept refereeing into their late teens. This in turn reflects very favourably on the mentoring program that we have been able to set up with senior referees being paid to provide verbal and written feedback to developing referees.

### **Referee Mentors**

These paid roles are now into their second year and have been a significant addition to the development of our referees.

These are generally taken from the senior Water Polo Victoria referee ranks and are mostly appointed to Thursday evening and Sunday games. The current list includes: Danny Flahive, Alby Morrison, David Smyth, Matthew Lea, William Ness, Chloe Lim, James Calabro, Olivia Hallam, Gareth Lewis and Javier Oh. They are now a recognised feature of Sunday Junior games.

### **Junior Referee Development**

Development opportunities continue to offer sound and valuable pathways for our younger referees at the national level. During the 2024-25 period, we had regular opportunities for promising junior referees to perform at national competitions. These included:

### Note 1. Statement of significant accounting policies

### 1. Statement of significant accounting policies

### 1. Statement of compliance

The committee has determined that the incorporated association is not a reporting entity because there are no users dependent on general purpose financial statements. The financial report is a special purpose financial report which has been prepared in order to satisfy the financial reporting requirements of the Associations Incorporation Reform Act 2012.

### 2. Basis of measurement

The financial statements have been prepared on an accrual basis and are based on historical cost and do not take into account changing money values except where specifically stated.

### 3. Plant & Equipment

Leasehold improvements and office equipment are carried at cost less, where applicable, any accumulated depreciation.

The depreciable amount of all PE is depreciated over the useful lives of the assets to the association commencing from the time the asset is held ready for use.

Leasehold improvements are amortised over the shorter of either the unexpired period of the lease or the estimated useful lives of the improvements.

### 4. Impairment of Assets

At each reporting date the committee assesses whether there is objective evidence that a financial instrument has been impaired. If any such indication exists, the recoverable amount of the asset, being the higher of the asset's fair value less costs to sell and value in use, is compared to the asset's carrying value. Any excess of the asset's carrying value over its recoverable amount is expensed to the income statement.

### 5. Income tax

The association is a not-for-profit organisation and is exempt from income tax under section 50-45 of the Income Tax Assessment Act 1997.

### 6. Cash and cash equivalents

Cash and cash equivalents includes cash on hand, deposits, held at call with banks, other short-term highly liquid investments with original maturities cash within three months.

### 7. Revenue

Revenue is measured at the fair value of the consideration received or receivable. Donation income is recognised when the entity obtains control over the funds, which is generally at the time of receipt.

### 8. Goods and services tax (GST)

Revenues, expenses and assets are recognised net of the amount of GST, except where the amount of GST incurred is not recoverable from the Australian Taxation Office (ATO). In these circumstances the GST is recognised as part of the cost of acquisition of an asset or as part of an item of expense. Receivables and payables are stated inclusive of GST.

### **9.** Trade creditors and other payables

Trade and other payables represent the liability outstanding at the end of the reporting period for goods and services received by the company during the reporting period, which remain unpaid. The balance is recognised as a current liability with the amounts normally paid within 30 days on recognition of the liability.

### 10. Employee provisions

Provision is made for the association's liability for employee benefits arising from services rendered by the end of the reporting period. Employee provisions have been measured at the amounts expected to be paid when the liability is settled.
